





He was honored with a Pulitzer Prize for Commentary in 1977 and published a number of books, including One Man's America: The Pleasures and Provocations of Our Singular Nation and Statecraft as Soulcraft. A media heavyweight, Will holds a a Ph.D. in politics from Princeton University and was once called "perhaps the most powerful journalist in America," by the Wall Street Journal.

PUSSY RIOT

Pussy Riot's anti-authoritarian stunts have gained international attention and the Kremlin's ire in recent years. Tolokonnikova and Alyokhina were famously arrested in 2012 after performing a song critical of Vladimir Putin in a Moscow cathedral. They were released in December 2013 after nearly two years in detention. Only two months later, they were famously attacked with whips by Cossack militia members at the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi.

In the past year, Pussy Riot has begun releasing English language songs, turning their attention to more international political topics.

PRINCE HANS-ADAM II OF LIECHTENSTEIN

The struggle for liberty takes many forms, and as a sitting ruler, Prince Hans-Adam II has thought a lot about how to promote and protect the liberties of the people of Liechtenstein. In fact, he's thought so much about the nature of the state that he wrote a book on the subject: *The State in the Third Millennium*. His central argument is that the growth of the state into ever more areas of citizens' lives has degraded its ability to perform its core and appropriate functions – such as the provision of national defense.



LYN ULBRICHT

Lyn Ulbricht is the mother of Ross Ulbricht, founder of the darknet market the Silk Road. In February 2015, Ross was sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole on charges of money laundering and computer hacking. With an appeal filed in January 2015, Lyn serves as Ross' strongest advocate, traveling the country to educate audiences about the criminal justice system and its follies.

Rebiya Kadeer is a human rights leader and former businesswoman who was ranked the 7th wealthiest individual in the People's Republic of China in the mid-1990s. She established a multimillion-dollar trading company before facing backlash for her human rights advocacy on behalf of the Uyghur people. Kadeer was eventually arrested in 1999 and sentenced to eight years in prison following a secret trial. She was released in 2005 and sent to the United States with refugee status. Today, she continues to fight for Uyghur human rights and she is widely regarded as the "spiritual mother" of the Uyghur people. Kadeer's advocacy work has been recognized internationally and she was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize in 2006, 2007, and 2008.

THOMAS DRAKE

Thomas Drake is a former senior executive at the National Security Agency where he blew the whistle on massive multi-billion dollar fraud, intelligence coverups, and the widespread violations of the rights of citizens through secret mass surveillance programs after 9/11. As retaliation and reprisal, the Obama Administration indicted Drake in 2010 as the first whistleblower since Daniel Ellsberg charged with espionage. Drake faced 35 years in prison as the government turned him into an enemy of the state for upholding his oath to support and defend the Constitution. In 2011, the government's case against him collapsed, and he went free in a plea deal. He is the recipient of the 2011 Ridenhour Truth Telling Prize, and the 2012 Hugh M. Hefner First Amendment Award.



SUSAN HERMAN

Susan N. Herman was elected President of the American Civil Liberties Union in October 2008. after having served on the ACLU National Board of Directors for twenty years, as a member of the Executive Committee for sixteen years and as General Counsel for ten years. Herman holds a chair as Centennial Professor of Law at Brooklyn Law School, where she currently teaches courses in Constitutional law and criminal procedure, and seminars on Law and Literature, and Terrorism and Civil Liberties.
